

UGC NET Syllabus

UGC NET exam syllabus comprises two papers- Paper-II and Paper-II and contains multiple-choice questions (MCQs). Candidates appearing for the UGC NET exam need to complete both the papers in the given time duration of three hours. The UGC NET Paper-I is of 'General Paper on Teaching and Research Aptitude' and is common and compulsory for all the candidates. On the other hand, for Paper-II, candidates need to choose a subject from a list of 81 subjects.

Given below is the detailed UGC NET syllabus along with best preparation tips and books to enable candidates start their preparations for the exam.

UGC NET Syllabus for Paper-I

In UGC NET Paper-I, a total of 50 MCQs are asked from General Paper on Teaching and Research Aptitude. Each question is of 2 marks in the paper. The questions are asked from Teaching Aptitude, Research Aptitude, Reading Comprehension, Communication, Reasoning (including Maths), Logical Reasoning, Data Interpretation, Information & Communication Technology (ICT), People & Environment and Higher Education System: Governance, Polity & Administration.
